

Tour outline

Dates: By agreement. The dates of the tour will be adjusted to suit your travel plans. Extensions to the tour are highly recommended. You may want to spend additional time star-gazing at the Mt John Observatory at Lake Tekapo or watching the little blue-eyed penguins and soaring albatrosses at Tairoa Head near Scottish-settled Dunedin. You may also want to add on an exciting 10-day (9 nights) journey through the magnificent North Island to complete your journey through the land of the Lord of the Rings.

Note: The tour package is a land package only. Overseas flights to suit your individual needs can be arranged for you or you can make your own flight arrangements if you prefer.

TRAVELLING THROUGH THE MAJESTIC SOUTH ISLAND OF NEW ZEALAND - NATURE'S PLAYGROUND

On Day 1, we will meet you at Christchurch International Airport and transfer you to your chosen accommodation for two nights which could be a luxury historic homestead nestled at the foot of the Port Hills just outside the city, which will be your home for two nights.



We will have plenty of time to look around Christchurch, now well into its recovery phase following the devastating earthquakes in 2010 and 2011. We will visit the gothic-style Arts Centre and see where our most famous scientist Lord Ernest Rutherford had his first laboratory before going on to split the atom at the



Cavendish Laboratory at the University of Cambridge in the United Kingdom.



You may also like to relax in an Edwardian punt drifting peacefully along the River Avon through the beautiful Botanical Gardens in this most English of New Zealand's cities. Visiting New Zealand's 'Garden City' when the daffodils are blooming in the Spring or when the trees are turning all the colours of Autumn is a delightful experience.

On Day 2, you may like to travel by road through the rolling hills of North Canterbury to Kaikoura to do some whale watching by boat or helicopter, or swim with the dolphins. You might want to sample some freshly caught crayfish, green-lipped mussels and beer battered chips at Nin's Bin as the locals do. If you want to spend the day relaxing closer to Christchurch, there will be plenty to explore in the city and around Banks



Peninsula. Walking along Sumner beach with a Hokey Pokey ice-cream is a Kiwi experience not to be missed.

On Day 3, we will drive from Christchurch to Mount Cook in the Southern Alps, where we will be based for two nights. This drive will take you across the Canterbury Plains and over Burke's Pass, past Lake Tekapo and over turquoise-blue canals to the head of Lake Pukaki. The distinctive blue colour of this lake is due to the glacial feed to the lake created by glacial flour, the extremely finely ground rock particles from the glaciers. On Day 4, you will have the option of taking the flight of your life by helicopter or fixed wing aircraft over the



mountains and glaciers of the Mount Cook and Westland World Heritage Parks. Alternatively, you might prefer just to marvel at New Zealand's highest peak from the comfort of an armchair or amble along one of the many easy walking tracks in the area.





On Day 5, we will continue our journey by road via Omarama and the rugged Lindis Pass to Queenstown, where we will stay for 4 nights in carefully chosen accommodation. Days 5, 6 and 7 will be spent in this area

of Central Otago known as New Zealand's natural playground with its vast range of activities for adrenaline junkies including jet boating, bungee jumping and white - water rafting. For the more sedate, there are steam boat cruises to sheep stations on the lake, visits to wineries, gentle walks in the native bush, scenic flights or spa and wellness options for those seeking total rest and relaxation.







Other activities include visiting the picturesque village of Arrowtown with its well-preserved Chinese mining settlement from the gold rush days in the 19th Century and for golf players there is a world class course at Millbrook Resort close to where actor Sam Neill has a home. We will not be short of things to do and will tailor our activities to accommodate your interests!







While based in Queenstown we will definitely visit Milford Sound either by air or road. Here we will cruise the majestic fiord and enjoy one of the world's most beautiful scenic destinations, which is part of the World Heritage Fiordland National Park. The fiord is known for towering Mitre Peak, rainforests and waterfalls, and

it is home to fur seal colonies, penguins and dolphins.

On Day 9, we will leave Queenstown and travel by road via Lakes Wanaka and Hawea through the spectacular Haast Pass to the West Coast of the South Island, where we will spend one night in a delightful location. This rugged, bush-clad, glacier-rich coast was home to large numbers of gold miners during the 19th Century and its scenery is among the most unspoiled in the world. Hopefully we will be in the season for whitebait which is a favourite treat for Kiwis. You may be less tempted by mountain oysters (lamb testicles) and huhu grubs which reportedly taste like peanut butter!







On Day 10, we will make our way back across the South Island to Christchurch via Arthur's Pass either by road or the famous TranzAlpine train, rightly described as one of the great train journeys of the world. This is the final day of the tour as currently scheduled and we will arrange your travel to Christchurch or Auckland International Airports depending on your onward travel plans.



Of course, you may want to stay longer in some or all of the places we are visiting or you may like to spend extra time visiting the Mt John Observatory at Lake Tekapo This astronomical research observatory is in an area designated A Dark Sky Reserve, one of only four such reserves in the world.

You may also want to add on a couple of days to see the little blue-eyed penguins and soaring albatrosses at Tairoa Head near Scottish-settled Dunedin.
