

VISITING BERGAMO AND THE MAGNIFICENT GARDENS AT LAKE COMO AND LAKE MAGGIORE

Our tour group will be picked up in Milan and driven through the Lombardian countryside to the fabulous hill town, Bergamo, the hometown of the composer Gaetano Donizetti. We will have to stop for a coffee at least in the Piazza Vecchia in the old walled town, described by La Corbusier as "the most beautiful square in Europe."

We will then move on to gorgeous Lake Como for three nights. To get our bearings we will take the funicular railway from Como to the village of Brunate, climbing 1,000 metres in seven minutes to enjoy breath-taking views of the lake. In "Charterhouse of Parma," Stendhal described Lake Como as an "enchanting spot, unequalled on earth in its loveliness." Virgil called it simply "our greatest" lake.





If we can tear ourselves away from enjoying al fresco refreshments on the lakeside, we will spend the next two days cruising the lake and visiting gorgeous villages like Bellagio with its stone staircases, cypress groves and beautiful gardens.

We will visit the outstanding gardens at Villa Serbelloni which stand on the site of Pliny the Elder's villa overlooking Bellagio. Another mustsee will be the celebrated gardens of Villa Melzi at Bellagio, where on a previous visit we met the head gardener who has won prizes in national competitions for his work.



Gazing across the lake we will see and later visit imposing Villa Carlotta with its equally impressive garden running down to the lake shore. Villa Carlotta was built between 1690 and 1743 for the luxury-loving Marquis Giorgio Clerici. The garden's collection is remarkable and includes palms, banana



trees, cacti, eucalyptus, a sequoia, orchids, and camellias among the more than 500 species. As the story goes, the owners of Villa Melzi and Villa Carlotta were great rivals and whenever either added to his villa and garden, it was tantamount to taunting the other in public.



Those of us who have seen the films "A Month by the Lake" or "Casino Royale" will be particularly delighted to visit Villa Balbianello, often described as the most magical villa in Italy. This picturesque property sitting on its own little promontory is composed of loggias, terraces, and palazzini all spilling down lush green slopes to the lake where there is an old Franciscan church, a magnificent stone staircase, and a statue of San Carlo Borromeo blessing the waters.



It will be hard to leave Como but we have much more to see. Our destination for the next four nights is majestic Lake Maggiore but on the way we will stop at Villa Cicogna at Bisuschio. This magnificent villa started its life in the 15th century as an

ancient hunting lodge and was subsequently embellished and completed between 1530 and 1559. The interior merges cleverly with the exterior and its seven levels of beautiful gardens were established by Ascanio Mozzoni in the 16th Century. Its walled-in





garden is a typical example of formal Italian garden design with box hedges, water basins, fountains and a grotto with remarkable water features and Robert cannot wait to show it to us.




After leaving Villa Cicogna, we will drive to our home on the Piedmont side of Lake Maggiore for the next four nights. Our hotel is situated in the elegant resort town of Stresa, where Ernest Hemingway and many other notable writers and artists created some of their most famous works. Imposing villas and opulent Art Nouveau hotels line the elegant lakeside, which is ideal for a gentle stroll. The town is renowned for its sophisticated atmosphere and is a pleasant place to potter about.







Stresa is the ideal place from which to visit the stunning Borromean Islands including the world-renowned Isola Bella which is shaped like a vessel with a villa at the prow and ten tiers of terraced gardens dropping





Stresa is also home to Villa Pallavicino with its wonderful lakefront gardens and wildlife museum. The trees are a major feature of the park at Villa Pallavicino including centuries-old chestnut trees and liriodendrons, red beeches, maples, larches, the majestic ginkgo biloba, tall sequoias and fragrant magnolias. A real attraction is the imposing cedar of Lebanon, in the natural amphitheatre outside the villa.



From Stresa our driver will take us to Villa della Porta Bozzolo, a splendid furnished 16th Century villa which was donated to the National Trust of Italy. It sits in the Varese province and has very splendid gardens To get there, we will take a vehicular ferry across Lake Maggiore.



To visit the last gardens of the tour, we will travel by ferry a short distance from Stresa to Villa Taranto in Pallanza. In 1931, an avid botanist Scottish Captain Neil McEacharn bought an estate called La Crocetta from the Marquise of Sant'Elia with the aim of transforming it into an English-style garden in an area of Italy which reminded him of his native Scotland. The result was the beautiful gardens we see today with a magnificent Valletta, terraced gardens with waterfalls, fountains and statues. The garden extends over 16 hectares crossed by 7 kilometres of paths and avenues and it is a riot of blooms with enticing scents.





Autumn will be a wonderful time to visit these world-famous gardens. The winding dahlia path shows off blooms from more than 300 species from June to October and in the hot-houses we will be able to admire extraordinary equatorial water lilies. Overall, the gardens contain nearly 20,000 plant varieties, representing over 3,000 species.

Captain McEacharn wanted to ensure his work would be continued after his death and he

generously donated the property to the Italian state in exchangefor permission to be buried in the mausoleum which now stands in the middle of the park. Captain McEacharn's generosity extended to

shipping over 11,000 packets of seeds to over 40 countries in 1959, to help other gardens around the world.

Sadly we have now come to the end of our tour and our driver will return us to Milan for our onward connections or (if we are lucky) our next tour "Dopo La Vendemmia" (After the Grape Harvest), during which we will make our way through Piedmont and Tuscany to Rome. Wherever our onward travels take us, we will have had a truly memorable experience visiting some of the most famous gardens on the shores of the northern Italian lakes
